2022 was a year of dynamic and positive change for our community. We have ushered in new and professional staff; instituted training and growth opportunities for current staff and made changes that will positively impact your engagement and experience with your government.

We have a new local permanent Chief of Police, Chief Ronald "Ron" Tarpley. He has hired several new officers in a very tough market, improved onsite working conditions, instituted a new policy for body-worn cameras and deployed new technology to deal with traffic, and violent crime in our community. Also, he is working across several agencies to proactively deal with some of the more endemic violence and undesirable activity in our community. The department has been working to deploy new schedules to ensure more hourly city coverage, with a focus on community policing and fostering a new relationship between residents and the brave men and women that keep us safe. He has also been building relationships and sharing resources with Prince George's County Police and our surrounding municipal police agencies.

We have a great website that is getting better everyday under the watchful eye of our new Media Coordinator. Ms. T'Neisha Turner.

We distributed funds to many of our most vulnerable residents through President Joe Biden's American Rescue Plan, and will be using those funds to upgrade our playgrounds and other public spaces.

In 2023, we will focus on restructuring Code Enforcement and working with a new committee to start the process of updating some of our very old, duplicative and inefficient codes and outdated fee structure. We will stay actively engaged with our partners with the Marlboro Pike Coalition, working to bring change to the corridor.

#### **Police Tips**



- Use a door viewer before opening your door. Always demand identification from strangers (even repair or sales persons).
- Always lock up your home before leaving and don't hide your house keys outdoors anywhere.
- Have keys ready and in your hand for immediate use when you return home.
- Use interior and exterior lighting at all times.
- Always use Safe Internet Shopping practices.
- Shred credit card offers and bank statements before you throw them away if you do not plan on using them.
- Hide or destroy boxes from expensive purchases.
- Do not answer personal questions about your home such as type of alarm, daytime occupancy, etc.
- Do not let people inside your home (to use the bathroom, phone, etc.).
- Avoid mail theft by obtaining a locked mailbox and dropping off outgoing mail at the local post office.
- Do not give out your personal information or credit card number over the phone unless you initiated the call.

#### Winter Tip:

Winter tip - do not use a broom to brush off ice and snow from the shrubbery. The branches are brittle and fragile. You just might do more harm than good. Be gentle or allow the snow/ice to melt by the hands of Mother Nature. Itching to have blooms during the winter months? Try growing Hellebore (a perennial) or Camellias (a beautiful shrub). Interested in a winter shrub that has a fragrance to enjoy during the colder months? Try growing Sarcococca hookeriana. Insignificant blooms add value from their fragrance that wafts through the winter garden. Almost like grandma's sweet perfume.

Call 800-698-2411 to file a claim for PACT Act-related disability compensation. Disabled Veterans (DAV) license plates will be available for veterans with 50 percent to 100 percent disability vs the current 100 percent requirement. 

#### Voter's Requirement:

Registered voter with the Prince George's County Board of Elections (BOE). You may register to vote at any time. However, voter registration is closed 21 days before an election.

Registration is permanent if the voter keep his/her address current with the Board of Elections. Residents will receive a Voter's Notification Card (VNC) by mail before the election. The VNC will have the voter's name, address, polling place and your WARD Number.

## Important information about Absentee Voting Important Note:

A recent change in the law requires the State Board of Elections and each local board of elections to refer to absentee ballots as "mail-in ballots" and absentee voting as "mail-in voting." Please note that this change in terminology does NOT change the process of Mail-in Voting.



What should I do if it snows?

In the event of snow, Public Works Department will plow the streets and open all entrances into the city. Wait before you shovel your driveways and around your vehicles.



Bulk trash is collected on Wednesdays (Appointment only). You must call by 2:00pm on Tuesday, before Wednesdays pick-up. Regular trash pick-up days are Monday and Thursday. 
