FALL LEAF COLLECTION



The Public Works Department will begin its annual Fall Leaf Collection on Wednesday, November 01, 2023.

The City will be divided into four sections, as shown on the map below. Piles of leaves with sticks, rocks, bricks, car parts, bottles, etc., will not be picked up. The leaves should be piled between the sidewalk and the curb, not more than four feet from the curb, as the vacuum hose will not reach any further. If the leaves are wet and heavy, they will not be picked up on the scheduled pick-up day until they become dry.


Please note: Leaves will be picked up non-scheduled from December 26, 2023, through January 2, 2024. After this time, all leaves must be put in brown lawn bags or a trash can with an "X" on the front or a note that says yard waste and placed curbside for Bates Trash Service, which picks up leaves and grass clipping on Mondays.

There will be no leaf collection on the following dates: November 10, 23, 24, and December 25, 2023. Tree limbs will not be picked up during the fall leaf removal season.

Limb pick-up will resume on Tuesday, January 14, 2024. Christmas trees will also be included in this pick-up.

Section I: November 1, 2, 3, 17,20, 21, & December 7, 8, 1. **Section II:** November 6,7, 8, 22, 27, 28, & December 12, 14, 15. **Section III:** November 9, 10, 13, 30, & December 1, 15, 18,19.

Section IV: November 14, 15 16, & December 4, 5, 6, 20, 21, 22.


