### The Next Chapter: Reimagining Marlboro Pike

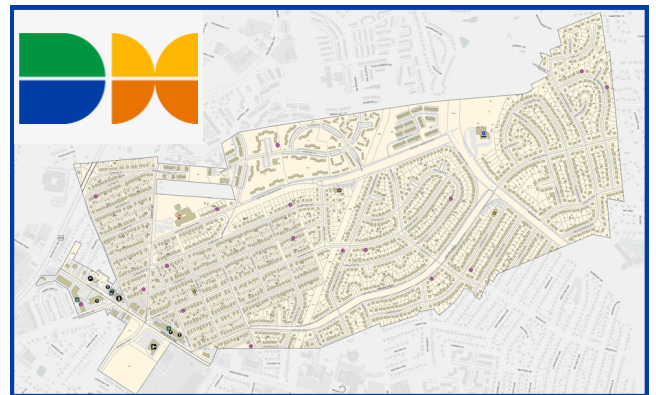

As part of this vision, **our Police Department will be relocating to Marlboro Pike in the near future**—placing law enforcement directly next to city-owned property and increasing police presence in the heart of our commercial corridor. This move will help create a safer, more welcoming environment for businesses, residents, and visitors alike.

## September is National Preparedness Month

September is National Preparedness Month, an annual observance aimed at raising awareness about the importance of being prepared for disasters and emergencies.

This month encourages individuals, families, and communities to take proactive steps to protect themselves and their loved ones from potential risks.

### Why is it important?

- **Disasters can strike unexpectedly:** Natural disasters like earthquakes, floods, and wildfires, as well as human-caused emergencies, can happen at any time.
- **Preparedness saves lives and reduces impact:** Being prepared can help you stay safe, minimize damage, and recover more quickly from an emergency.
- **It's a shared responsibility:** Everyone has a role to play in emergency preparedness, from individuals to communities and organizations.

### What can you do?

- **Create a plan:** Develop a family emergency plan that includes communication strategies, evacuation routes, and meeting points.
- **Build a kit:** Gather essential supplies like water, non-perishable food, first-aid supplies, medications, and other necessities to sustain yourself for several days.
- **Stay informed:** Sign up for local emergency alerts and warnings, and learn about potential hazards in your area.
- **Practice your plan:** Conduct drills and practice your evacuation procedures to ensure everyone knows what to do.
- **Get involved:** Participate in community preparedness activities and support local emergency management efforts.
- **Tailor your plan:** Consider your specific needs and circumstances, including those of family members, pets, and any special needs.
- **Document and insure your property:** Take inventory of your belongings and ensure you have adequate insurance coverage.
- **Safeguard important documents:** Store copies of essential documents like identification, insurance policies, and medical records in a safe and accessible location.

## Public Hearing on September 4

The Mayor and Commission will reconvene from recess on Thursday, September 4th, at 7 PM for the City's first meeting of the fall—a Public Hearing on multiple proposed Charter Amendments. These amendments address a range of municipal matters, including meeting procedures, quorum requirements, salaries for elected officials, ordinance adoption processes, and public notice requirements. This hearing is an important opportunity for residents to learn more about the proposed changes and share their input before decisions are made.



**The More You Know:** Public Hearing Notices are legally required to be sent to the Prince George's Post. In addition, the City shares notices through its traditional communication channels—posting to the City website, social media, and making printed copies available in high-traffic locations across campus, including the main Municipal Campus lobby, Senior Center lobby, Recreation lobby, and Youth Services Bureau (YSB) lobby.

## Treasurer's Tips

As the State of Maryland has begun mailing tax bills, I am happy to share information for a **Homeowner's Tax Credit**. The State of Maryland provides a credit for the real property tax bill for homeowners of all ages who qualify on the basis of gross household income. The credit shall be limited to the portion of the dwelling that is used only for the applicant's residential purposes.

Patrol Services Bureau Commander, Major Timothy Hodge shared that "K9 Sophie is a great addition to the Team who can calm a child in crisis, provide a senior citizen a moment of kindness and warmth, and provide a Police Officer time to reduce stressful situations."

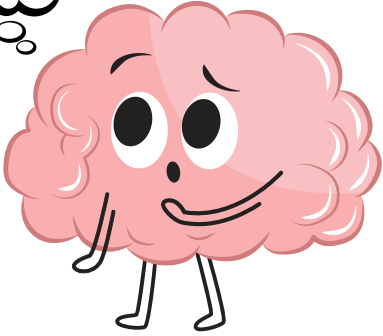

## Prevent Falls, Stay Independent: 6 Steps for Senior Safety

1. Find a good balance and exercise program
2. Talk to your healthcare provider
3. Review your medications regularly
4. Check your vision and hearing annually
5. Keep your home environment safe
6. Start conversations with your family members

One of the most effective ways to prevent falls is to improve your strength and balance through regular movement. 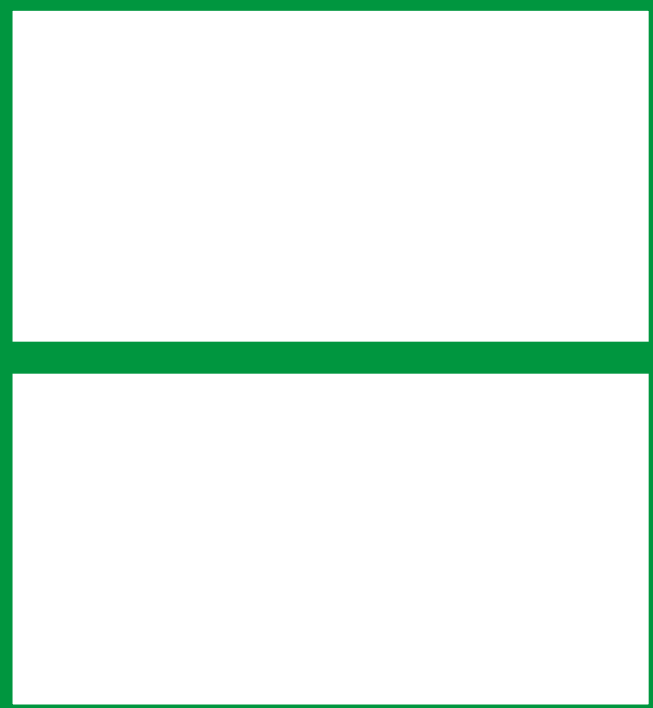
